Before Registration

Complete and submit an MSCC Application. MSCC offers two ways for you to submit an Admissions Application. You can submit an on-line application through the MSCC website (www.midsouthcc.edu, click on red "Apply Now" box). The on-line admission is not complete until all required documentation has been provided to the Admissions Office, including the application signature page with the applicant's signature. Or you can pick up an Admissions Application form from the Admissions Office in the Donald W. Reynolds Center on the South Campus.

We'll need your official high school transcript or GED scores, along with your shot record from your doctor's office or the health department. If you're transferring from another college, we will need that transcript as well.

Complete and submit financial aid application. *Interested in Financial Aid for summer school?* Eligibility is determined by your completed 2010-11 FAFSA. Come by the Financial Aid Office in the Admissions Office, Reynolds Center, or call 870.733.6729. Students may choose to send an email to fnaid@midsouthcc.edu to check your eligibility.

Submit your ACT or SAT results to the Admissions Office OR take the COMPASS placement test (\$10). See the COMPASS Testing Schedule for times.

During Registration

Come to the Reynolds Center during registration hours. You'll meet with an advisor and register for your classes. There will be knowledgeable MSCC staff to help you through every step.

Course Fees

Tuition Waiver for Arkansas Residents 60 & Over

As provided by Act 678 of the Arkansas Legislature, tuition is waived for Arkansas residents age 60 and over who wish to take credit courses. Eligible students must pay any applicable course/lab fees and purchase textbooks. *Students must register during late registration and may be required to show proof of age.*

Refund of Tuition

Tuition will be refunded on a prorated basis according to the date of official withdrawal and the number of credit hours in which the student is enrolled. Course fees are not refundable unless the student withdraws prior to the first day of class. The Summer 2010 refund schedule is as follows: full-term classes dropped by June 7th receive 80% refund. MSCC's College Transfer Program

Thinking about transferring?

MSCC currently offers a complete college-transfer curriculum through its Associate of Arts (AA) degree program. You can complete the first two years of basic college courses in English, mathematics, social science, fine arts, and humanities (while continuing to live and work at home).

The Registrar's Office can help you while you are planning to transfer. The staff can provide information and a current list of colleges and universities accepting MSCC credits in transfer.

Most colleges and universities will accept transfer credits from MSCC, which is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools. However, the acceptance of transfer credit is the prerogative of the receiving institution. You should obtain assurances in advance from the institution to which you wish to transfer.

Students can obtain current information about the transferability of MSCC courses to Arkansas public colleges and universities by accessing the Arkansas Course Transfer System (ACTS). Students are guaranteed the transfer of courses listed in ACTS and assured equitable treatment in the application of those credits for the admissions and degree requirements. This listing represents the minimum number of transfer courses that may be accepted by a particular Arkansas institution. Students wishing to transfer a course not listed in ACTS should contact the receiving institution to determine transferability. Visit www.adhe.edu and select Course Transfer for more information.
