**Purpose of this form:** As of the date you filed your FAFSA, you indicated “Yes” to the status of “Dislocated Worker” on question #85 (parent) or #103 (independent student as defined by the FAFSA, questions 48 through 60). This form will be used to verify this answer.

*A person may be considered a dislocated worker if s/he is:*

- *Receiving unemployment benefits due to being laid off or losing a job and is unlikely to return to a previous occupation; has been laid off, or received a lay-off notice from a job;*
- *Was self-employed but is now unemployed due to economic conditions or natural disaster;*
- *Or is a displaced homemaker. A displaced homemaker is generally a person who previously provided unpaid services to the family (e.g., a stay-at-home mom or dad), is no longer supported by the husband or wife, is unemployed, or underemployed and is having trouble finding or upgrading employment.*

**As of the date you filed your FAFSA, is either of your parents (or you) a dislocated worker?** (Q85) If a person quits work, generally s/he is not considered a dislocated worker even if, for example, the person is receiving unemployment benefits. If you answer “Yes,” additional documentation to support your unemployment status may be required.
